Buyer Notes

- Make sure you buy something that is Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA)–compliant. Most vendors should be aware, but it's ultimately up to the buyer to know, for example, that anything over 22 feet long must have at least two wheelchair spaces. Also, pay special attention to certain lighting and lifts requirements.
- Don't overlook leasing options, experts emphasize. Many providers do not maintain vehicles properly or regularly enough, often opting to "run them into the ground"—or at least until frequent, costly repairs are needed. Leasing also saves a big capital expenditure up front.
- Caution on pricing: Cheaper prices can equal cheaper construction, which can create noisier, rougher rides.
