FROM THE FRONT LINES:

"You really have to look at the warranty. Some are only two years on the mattress and one year on the pump. We got two or three years on the pump and five years on the mattress. A number of years ago, we got a top-of-the-line mattress that performed well, but when it broke down after the warranties were out, the expenses to fix it were phenomenal."

Buyer Notes

- Experts recommend having some sort of static perimeter edge. Otherwise, as a mattress loses air (or in the event of a power loss), the resident could roll toward the edge and essentially be "pushed off." This can be in addition to border bolsters, which have become must-haves.
- Many users prefer modular mattresses. Then, if one section fails, the entire mattress doesn't have to be replaced.
- Vendors said they're mindful of providers' reimbursement struggles and are trying to holding prices steady accordingly. Tight budgets have driven more rentals lately.
