### **Buyer Notes**

- The cost of a room set varies, but one major purchase item is a wardrobe or armoire. Some facilities are opting to build those into a room rather than purchase a standalone piece of furniture. Almost all rooms would be expected to have a bedside table and dresser.
- Providers often prefer durable furniture, generally in a traditional, Shaker-style look, with rounded edges and handles versus knobs. While practicality trumps style, there is usually a desire for something that still looks fashionable.
- Check to see how heavy a piece of furniture is. It should be lightweight enough so it can be moved to clean but heavy enough so that it won't easily topple.
- Ask if the furniture has laminate protection, like thermofoil, that will help protect it from wear and tear.
