Average price per resident room:

Varies from around \$500 to \$1,000

Pricing Trends

2007-2008: +2% to +3% **2008-2009:** +3% to +5% **2010 projection:** Flat to +3%

Typical delivery time: Varies, from overnight to about four weeks

Typical delivery charges: Often included in installed price. Ask before buying.

Average life span of product: 7 to 10 years typical

Installation: Many are 100% wireless, but more traditional systems require bulkier hardwiring and therefore, special help

Average maintenance cost per year: Approximately 10% of the overall system cost. Push buttons/cords most frequent expense; software updates the most costly.

Buyer Notes

- Make sure you compare systems, but be careful about information overload. Features will blur if you compare 10 companies, for example. Choose just a handful; then narrow down before testing.
- Better technology and the addition of more options will generally keep pushing prices upward. Wireless units are seeing the biggest gains in popularity.
- It's important to bring staff members on board as early as possible in the system adoption process; it's also a good idea to involve staff as much as possible in shopping for these items.
