### **Buyer Notes**

- There is an emphasis toward ergonomics in seating, and an increasing number of products being offered. Providers are moving toward transitional models.
- Clean lines, firm cushions and removable seats are all important in long-term care settings.
- More residents want chairs with a cushion option to support their iPads or laptops.
- Recliners are still popular (and more expensive), but more facilities are moving away from high-back chairs and bulky chairs. Fewer are purchasing bariatric seating products, as residents don't want to be put in the "fat guy" chair.
- Metal frames are increasingly popular over wood frames, and durability is considered as important as price.
- Ask about delivery, and whether the facility needs to have a lift-gate truck. Evaluate the total cost, and be careful when unpackaging.
