Buyers Notes

- Power-based legs, opposed to manual legs, are considered to be "in," especially given concerns about workplace injuries.
- One big problem with a lift is when the sling wears out. Make sure to check it for fraying.
- Ask about weight limit, and whether the lift comes with a spare battery.
- Depending on the market, durable medical equipment competitive bidding has sometimes resulted in lift prices dropping.

"We got one lift and it wasn't tall enough. Make sure it's high enough and has the right weight limit. If you don't have one, it kills you. You can't get referrals otherwise."
