

## Fall prevention

### Snapshot

**Pricing based on number of people to protect:**

Varies by product, vendor and service terms.

**Average price per resident per year:**

Depending on system, could range from \$45 to \$550 per year.

### Pricing Trends

2010-2011: Flat to +2%

2011-2012: +1% to +3%

2012-2013: +2%

**Typical delivery time:** Can be as quick as overnight, or up to about 2 weeks

**Typical delivery charges:** UPS or freight

**Average life span of product:** 1 to 10 years

**Power source:** Electricity or battery

**Installation:** Staff members can install most systems.

**Average maintenance cost per year:**

Sensor pads and batteries are continuing costs. Ask vendor for reliable estimates, as systems will vary widely.

### Buyer Notes

- Make an effort to try any system you're considering with an actual resident(s). Because the features on fall prevention systems can vary so much, you have to be sure that they will work for you, and in your surroundings. Also, some providers tend to "over buy" for the capabilities they want or really need.
- Ask how fall-detection and prevention devices can be integrated with your other resident safety systems. You should expect them to be able to interact in some meaningful way, now and in the future.
- If you don't see or hear about what you think you want in a fall prevention system, ask. The capabilities of some of them have expanded greatly, including some with expansive reporting capabilities you might be interested in.
